

On April 14th, DCFR will host the wonderful Dr. Naazneen Barma.

Dr. Barma is an Assistant Professor at the Naval Post-Graduate School in Monterey, California. She will be presenting on The Challenges of Post-Conflict Peacebuilding with time allotted afterwards for members and guests to engage in conversation and ask questions. Dr. Barma's research and teaching focus on the political economy of development, international interventions in post-conflict states, and natural resource governance, with a regional specialization in East Asia and the Pacific. Prior to joining the faculty at NPS, Dr. Barma was a Young Professional and Public Sector Specialist at the World Bank, where she conducted political economy analysis and worked on operational dimensions of governance and institutional reform in the East Asia Pacific Region. She has over fifteen years of full-time and consulting experience with the World Bank and other aid agencies. In addition to her academic endeavors, Dr. Barma is currently completing a book manuscript on political order in post-conflict developing countries, with a focus on Afghanistan, Cambodia, and East Timor. She is also one of three principal investigators who recently won a Minerva Award to conduct a new study examining the relationship between state-building and peace-building through the lens of public service delivery in Cambodia, Laos, and Uganda.

World Affairs Challenge Announcement

On March 5, two teams from Basalt High School participated in the annual World Affairs Challenge (WAC) competition held at Denver's Regis University. DCFR is proud to have awarded a grant to the school for its participation in this event based on the criteria of merit, financial need, and its being a rural school.

The WAC is a competitive event where students from Colorado and neighboring states present on a specific global theme, this year's theme being "Smart Villages." Students examined how remote, off-grid communities integrate the basic necessities of life — water, agriculture, energy, sanitation, health, and education. Each team presented to judges its work on a real-world need, bringing in inventive, collaborative, and holistic solutions. Through media technology, teams were able to collaborate with students of other countries. The day included speakers, introductions to international organizations and on -the-spot "challenge questions" that constructively mixed students from various schools.

WAC's mission is to develop tomorrow's global leaders. With mentoring, education, and competition, WAC facilitates middle- and high-school learning about world affairs, and engages youth to examine some of the world's most pressing problems. WAC students learn to think critically, collaborate, communicate, and analyze world affairs through an integrated understanding.
